

## **NOTICE TO WISCONSIN JUDICARE CLIENTS**

Federal law now requires that before an attorney paid by Wisconsin Judicare may file a complaint or begin negotiations on your behalf, you must sign a written statement that states the facts that form the basis of your claim. If you do not understand English, the statements must also be written in a language you understand.

The Statement of Facts will be kept on file at Wisconsin Judicare and must be made available to any Federal department or agency that is auditing or monitoring the activities of the Legal Services Corporation or of Wisconsin Judicare, Inc., and to any auditor or monitor receiving Federal funds to conduct such auditing or monitoring, including any auditor or monitor of the Legal Services Corporation.

No other disclosure of this Statement of Facts will be made to any other persons or agencies except as may be required by law.

In Wisconsin, the name of a lawyer's client and the client's statements are confidential and may not be disclosed to anyone else without the client's permission. By signing this Statement of Facts, you are waiving your right to have this Statement of Facts and your identity kept confidential, and this Statement of Facts and your identity may be disclosed as outlined above. By making this waiver, you are not waiving your right to have any other information kept confidential or your right to the protection of the attorney-client privilege.
